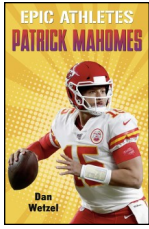

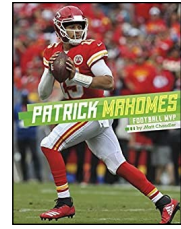

The more specific the topic, the more specific the number. For example, you can find nonfiction books about **Patrick Mahomes & football** in the **796.332s**.



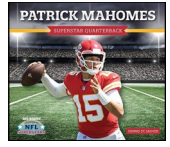

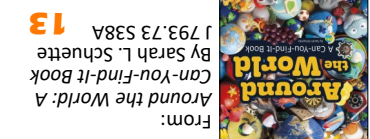

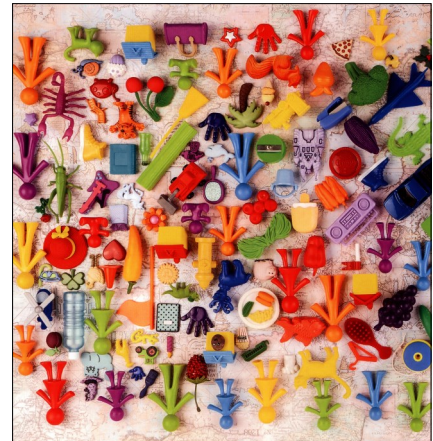

900-999	geography & history (pirates, flags, presidents, biographies, states, countries, family trees)



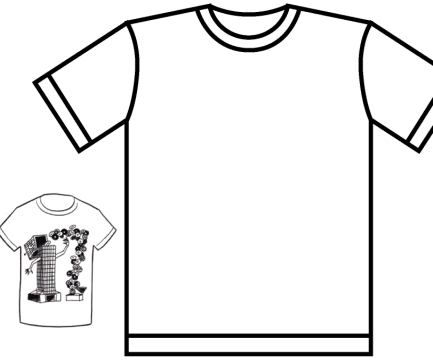

Dreaming with Pluto

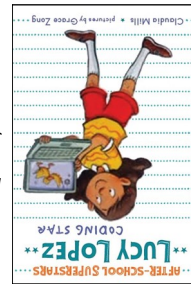

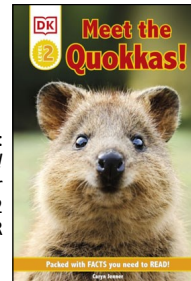

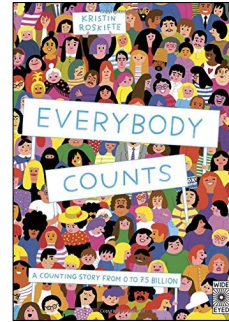
