



The Dewey Decimal System is a way to keep items in order by subject. It helps you find what you are looking for! In this system, books are numbered, from 000 to 999, and every topic has a number. The more specific the topic, the more specific the number. For example, you can find nonfiction books about food (including cookbooks with yummy recipes) in the 641s.



Full STEAM ahead

Sparks in the dark!



1. Stand in a dark room, facing a mirror.
2. Chew a wintergreen life savers with your mouth open.
3. Look for flashes of light.

What's happening? When you crunch candy, electrons in the sugar crystals separate from the molecules. When the electrons recombine with the molecules, they emit light.
