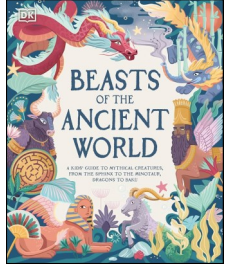


## How Dewey find the books?

The Dewey Decimal System is a way to keep items in order by subject. It helps you find what you are looking for! In this system, books are numbered, from 000 to 999, and every topic has a number. The more specific the topic, the more specific the number. For example, you can find nonfiction books about **mythical beasts** in the **398.2454s**.

<b>000-099</b>	general stuff (computers, UFOs, world records, journalism, libraries, things like Bigfoot)
<b>100-199</b>	philosophy & psychology (feelings, self-help, dreams, spooky stuff)
<b>200-299</b>	religion & mythology
<b>300-399</b>	social sciences (family, money, government, voting, holidays, transportation, folk & fairy tales)
<b>400-499</b>	languages (dictionaries, grammar)
<b>500-599</b>	natural sciences (math, plants, weather, dinos, bugs, animals)
<b>600-699</b>	ways to use science (technology, health, cooking, pets, building)
<b>700-799</b>	art & recreation (crafts, fashion, dancing, music, games, sports)
<b>800-899</b>	literature (poetry, plays, jokes)
<b>900-999</b>	geography & history (pirates, flags, presidents, biographies, states, countries, family trees)

## Healthy choices

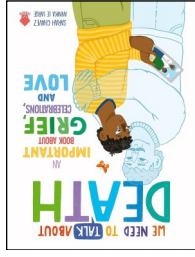

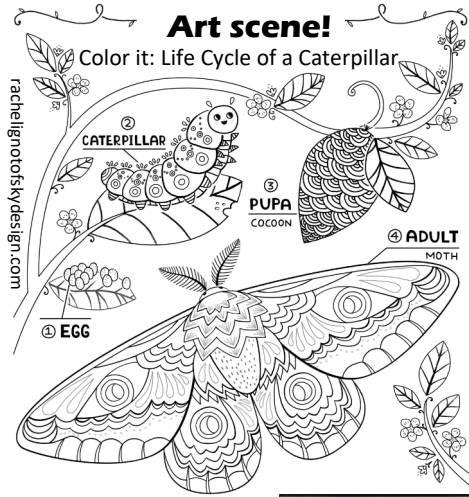

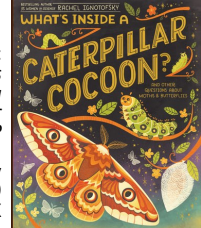
Color it: Life Cycle of a Caterpillar

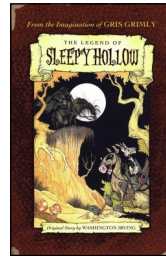
