How Dewey find the books?
 The Dewey Decimal System is a way to keep items in order by subject. It helps you find what you are looking for! In this system, books are numbered, from 000 to 999, and every topic has a number. The more specific the topic, the more specific the number. For example, you can find nonfiction books about **writing** in the **808s**.

100-199	philosophy & psychology (feelings, self-help, dreams, spooky stuff) 
200-299	religion & mythology

400-499	languages (dictionaries, grammar)
500-599	natural sciences (math, plants, weather, dinos, bugs, animals) 
600-699	ways to use science (technology, health, cooking, pets, building) 
700-799	art & recreation (crafts, fashion, dancing, music, games, sports) 
800-899	literature (poetry, plays, jokes)
900-999	geography & history (pirates, flags, presidents, biographies, states, countries, family trees)

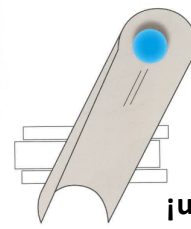
