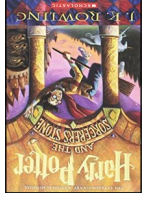

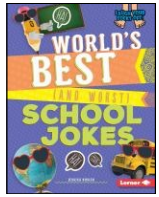

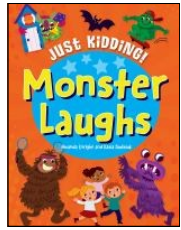

Dewey by the numbers

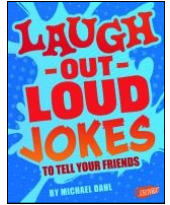

Fizz Fountain

(CAUTION: Ask for permission & only do this outdoors where it's OK to make a big mess!)

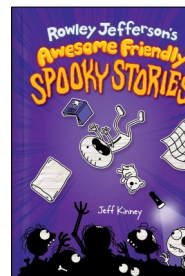
1. Open a bottle of diet cola.
2. Put lots of salt in a folded paper.

* Why? Fizzy drinks have lots of carbon dioxide gas, which normally bubbles out gradually. But salt makes the gas come out quickly, in big bubbles.



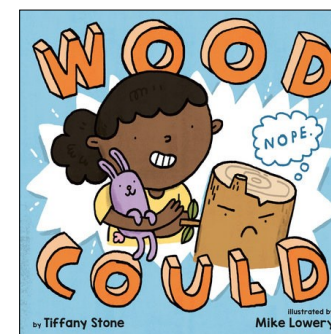
